

WRPS contributes to "Birds & Blooms"

The annual spring art show is underway at Lake Metro Park's Penitentiary Glen Nature Center. This year's show is entitled Birds & Blooms and features photography and craftwork celebrating the annual return of the season's flowers and fowl to Northeast Ohio. Many WRPS members contributed to this year's show (see list below), which runs through May 13th. Artists and art lovers mingled and enjoyed the colorful displays at an opening reception on March 10th from noon to 4 PM

Handcrafts on exhibition include customized birdhouses. Participants purchased a standard birdhouse for a nominal fee and demonstrated their creativity in redecorating in whatever style they wanted. Redecorating varies from simply painting, all the way up to and including disassembling and reassembly, transforming it into an entirely different structure by altering the form, adding architectural facades and other artistic features. Birdhouses made from scratch using a variety of materials, ceramic art and other artistic media are also featured in the show.

Yearly art shows at Penn Glen are designed to provide Lake County residents with a greater variety of experiences, attract new visitors (both local and national), expand visitors' knowledge of the natural world and encourage a connection between art and nature. Select artwork at Birds & Blooms is available for sale, with a portion of the proceeds benefiting Lake Metronal and adventional programs.

WRPS Education: Learning Some New Tricks

A dozen or so WRPS members recently learned some new post production methods to enhance their images. Immediate past President Jackie Sajewski taught two education sessions in March on the use of Photoshop

The March 6th class, <u>Up to 10 Quick Skills to Improve</u> your <u>Images</u>, concentrated on such quick skills as straightening, transforming (scale, rotate, skew, distort, perspective and warp), removing something from an image through cloning, patching and content awareness. Tips were also shared on the use of curves, Photoshop filters, gradients, text special effects, hue, saturation,

and sharpening. On March 20th the class, Working with Layers: Photoshop CC, Photoshop CS and Elements, gave participants the opportunity to discover how to use layers and create and work with layer stacks, by learning how to hide what they want hidden and reveal effects they want shown. Additionally, they learned and practiced blending techniques, opacity leveling, masking and inverting masks. The in-depth class was designed to allow photographers to become more comfortable working with layers and masks.

THANK YOU TO THE JUDGES OF THE STORY TELLING COMPETITION 2/27/2018

Jeannette Palsa

I am an artist that rebels against the "Artist Statement". When I begin working I never know where the imagery will take me or what it really means until the body of work emerges and then comes the "moment of understanding" and I suddenly grasp what it was that I was trying to say. I am an assembler of odd, interesting and unusual visual objects. I create visually interesting imagery. No more . . . no less. Each piece created is received optically by the viewer, mentally digested and found interesting or dismissed in the blink of an eye. I will share that all of my works are original and created with the help of models in my studio. Nothing is preconceived . . . each work is born unto itself.

My "creative" work is more art than photograph. I feel that I am more of a photographic artist than a photographer in many cases. I also value the concept of the "hand-made artifact." This has always been my vision and because of this I have worked in many of the historic photographic processes which were discovered and utilized in the 1800's. I have worked in the following processes: gum dichromate, platinum/palladium printing, the wet-plate collodion process, daguerreotypes and photographic encaustics. For the past 10 years my process of choice has been wet-plate collodion to produce ambrotypes (on glass) tintypes (on metal) and orotones (a reverse collodion process). The past two years I have been experimenting with photographic encaustic and hope to continue and see where it takes me. A former WRPS member from the 2000-2005 years, who once served as VP of programs and webmaster for the very first WRPS website. He is now the VP and Education Chair of the Finger Lakes Photography Guild in New York. He is a 2005 graduate of the New York Institute of Photography. He has also worked part time as a photo printer at Van's Photo in Mentor, where he also dabbled in camera sales on occasion.

Photographically, Jim's interest are varied. With a background predominantly in nature, landscape and macro work, he started out early in his photographic career shooting birds of prey for the Wildlife Center at Penitentiary Glen. Since moving to New York, he has been doing a lot of photography as part of his fulltime job as the Camp Manager for a 4-H Summer camp, where he is photographing campers and staff for marketing purposes. In recent years, however, he has begun shooting weddings, senior portraits, modeling portfolios and even a bit of real estate photography. He enjoys pushing his limits a bit, and exploring new genres. He self-published his first photo book, titled "Ink", in 2016, in which he shares images of people with tattoos and the stories behind the ink. The images were all taken in his small home studio, and the project has proven to be a great way to get a lot more experience shooting people in studio.

RULES FOR WRPS COMPETITION ENTRY

- 1. Any current (yearly Membership Dues paid) WRPS member may submit entries.
- 2. All images must be titled or they will be disqualified. "Untitled" does not constitute a title. Titles must be limited to 17 characters.
- 3. All images that have previously won a WRPS competition are ineligible for any future WRPS competitions (except current year-end club choice).
- 4. All WRPS members may submit a MAXIMUM of 4 images. You may submit in any of the 2 categories, Black & White or Color, but your total entries may not exceed 4 images with no more than 2 images per category.
- 5. All images and post processing must be the original work of the entrant.
- 6. No text or digital frames are allowed in the images. Maker may use a 2 pixel *white* stroke to indicate image size if it does not fill the 1400 x 1050.
- 7. Entries that do not meet the rules of the particular competition will be disqualified. Entrant will have forty-eight hours to resubmit a corrected or alternate entry in place of the disqualified entry.
- 8. Any category where there is just one entrant, that person will receive a single award for the entry with highest points from the judges. If the highest scoring entry receives 21 points or higher the entry will receive a first place award. If the entry receives 20 points or lower it will receive an Honorable Mention.
- 9. The <u>WRPS</u> competition entry email addresses are: <u>WRPSAGROUP@gmail.com</u> or <u>WRPSBGROUP@gmail.com</u>. All entries must be submitted to the Competition Chairperson no later than 9:00 PM on the due date. A confirmation e-mail will be sent within 48 hours for entries received via e-mail. Please note earlier submissions are allowed. If you do not have email, you can submit your entries by CD at the meeting prior to the competition meeting. Refer to competition schedule or cheat sheet for exact deadlines.

WRPS Competition Cheat Sheet 2017-2018 (the back page)

Nature (PSA & WRPS)	Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archaeology, in such a fashion that the well-informed person will be able to identify the subject material and certify its honest presentation. The story telling value of the photograph must be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall NOT to be present, except where those human elements are integral parts of the nature story such as nature subjects, like barn owls or storks, adapted to an environment modified by humans, or where those human elements are in situations depicting natural forces, like humicanes or tidal waves. Scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals are permissible. Photographs of human created hybrid plants, cultivated plants, feral animals, domestic animals, or mounted specimens are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement. No techniques that add, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content, or without altering the content of the original scene, are permitted including HDR, focus stacking and dodging/burning. Techniques that remove elements added by the camera, such as dust spots, digital noise, and film scratches, are allowed. Stitched images are NOT permitted. ALL ALLOWED ADJUSTMENTS MUST APPEAR
Pictorial	derivations, are NOT allowed in nature competition. Anything goes! (The photographic work must be the maker's, commercial clip art is not allowed, etc.)
Travel	The Photo Travel Division is one of PSA's reality-based divisions (the others are Nature and Photojoumalism). We seek to portray the world as close to reality as we find it. For that reason, PTD has a PT Definition. The definition provides guidelines for the photographer and for competition judges as to what is permitted and what is not permitted in a PT image. The definition is as follows: A Photo Travel image expresses the characteristic features or culture of a land as they are found naturally. There are no geographic limitations. Images from events or activities arranged specifically for photography, or of subjects directed or hired for photography are not appropriate. Close up pictures of people or objects must include features that provide information about the environment. Techniques that add, relocate, replace or remove any element of the original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. The only allowable adjustments are removal of dust or digital noise, restoration of the appearance of the original scene, and complete conversion to greyscale monochrome.
