

In the month of March we have two exciting presentations. See the biographies below.

## Andrew Cross—Aerial Photography Presenting on Tuesday, March 14, 2017

Andy Cross is a FAA Certificated private pilot and a FAA Part 107 certificated commercial UAV (drone) pilot. He operates his UAVs in conjunction with his business AC Aerial Photography doing aerial photography for real estate, commercial, inspection, landscape, etc. in addition to hobby and recreational photography.

Andy was one of the first in NE Ohio to get approval from the FAA (333 Exemption) for commercial use of UAVs (May 2015). He has operated and built camera carrying multicopters for a number of years prior to getting commercially approved.

He is a veteran of the 82nd Airborne Division, US Army, a graduate of Kent State (BS Aerospace Technology) and an engineer by trade making

aircraft turbine blades and more recently factory automation. He is a member of AOPA, EAA, RCAPA, and AMA and promotes the safe and legal use of Drones for Photography. In addition to Aerial Photography he enjoys honing his skills in "ground based" Landscape and wildlife photography.

Andy will discuss the evolution and challenges of UAV/drone aerial photography, the equipment, cameras, techniques, safety and legal requirements of drone use.

He will bring a variety of pro and consumer drones and also talk about recommendations of getting into the hobby/profession.

#### David Chew—Water in its Many Forms

Presenting on Tuesday, March 28, 2017

My landscape and nature photographs represent outdoor experiences I've had over the last 20 years, including backpacking, mountaineering, canoeing and exploring both local and remote areas.

When living in Northern California, I took my wife's new camera backpacking in the Sierras. That experience brought so many questions and so much curiosity around how cameras and film see the world. More importantly, it gave me an entirely new view of the world. Although I have a long history of exploring the outdoors, that experience made me notice and appreciate the outdoors at another level.

Water and its effect is one of my favorite photographic subjects; water can be chaotic or calm and serene. This dynamic nature of water implies a time scale that is an important aspect of my photographic style. My images represent an effort to showcase the incredible detail of the natural environment.

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#### **RULES FOR WRPS COMPETITION ENTRY**

- I. Any current (yearly Membership Dues paid) WRPS member may submit entries.
- 2. All images must be titled or they will be disqualified. "Untitled" does not constitute a title. Titles must be limited to 17 characters.
- 3. All images that have previously won a WRPS competition are ineligible for any future WRPS competitions (except current year-end club choice).
- 4. All WRPS members may submit a MAXIMUM of 4 images. You may submit in any of the 2 categories, Black & White or Color, but your total entries may not exceed 4 images with no more than 2 images per category.
- 5. All images and post processing must be the original work of the entrant.
- 6. No text or digital frames are allowed in the images. Maker may use a 2 pixel **white** stroke to indicate image size if it does not fill the  $1400 \times 1050$ .
- 7. Entries that do not meet the rules of the particular competition will be disqualified. Entrant will have forty-eight hours to resubmit a corrected or alternate entry in place of the disqualified entry.
- 8. Any category where there is just one entrant, that person will receive a single award for the entry with highest points from the judges. If the highest scoring entry receives 21 points or higher the entry will receive a first place award. If the entry receives 20 points or lower it will receive an Honorable Mention.

# photography contest

ENTRIES ACCEPTED beginning Monday, May 1, 2017 at Penitentiary Glen Nature Center, 8668 Kirtland-Chardon Road, Kirtland. Entries can be submitted and payment made at the Information Desk from 9 am to 4:30 pm daily.

ENTRY DEADLINE is 4:30 pm, Wednesday, May 31, 2017. Entry form and payment must accompany entries.

DIVISIONS are Adult and Junior (ages 14 and younger).

ENTRY FEE is \$5 per print for adults, \$3 per print for juniors (ages 14 and younger). Cash in the EXACT amount or personal check (made out to Lake Metroparks) accepted.

ENTRIES Adults may submit a maximum of six photographs in the contest; Juniors (ages 14 and younger) may enter a maximum of three photos in the contest. No more than two photographs may be submitted by anyone in a single category.

OPENING RECEPTION and awards ceremony will be held on Friday, June 9, 2017, at 7:30 pm at Penitentiary Glen Nature Center. Winners will be announced and prizes awarded. Light refreshments will be served.

PRIZES are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place and Best of Show winners. Ribbons are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place and Honorable Mention winners in each category. All winners are determined by independent contest judges.

EXHIBIT of all qualifying entries will be on display Saturday, June 10 through Sunday, August 6, 2017 in Penitentiary Glen Nature Center. CATEGORIES: Photos can be either film or digital

- 1. LAKE METROPARKS- Color photos should highlight a unique natural aspect of a particular park within Lake Metroparks and may include people, animals or architecture as it relates to the park. The park location must be clearly identified. Please note that North Chagrin Reservation is NOT part of Lake Metroparks.
- LAKE ERIE Color photographs submitted in this
  category should highlight Lake Erie and its unique
  shoreline. Photos may include people, animals or
  architecture as it relates to the lake.
- WILDLIFE- This category is for color photos that feature wildlife such as birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and insects. \*Note: Domestic animals do not qualify for this category.
- 4. LANDSCAPE/FLORAL Color photos in this category should feature scenic images of nature and/or flowers. Photos may include animals or architecture as they relate to the landscape or flowers.



- CLOUDS- Clouds and their many shapes, sizes and colors are the subject of this new category of color photos. Images may include animals (birds) or other natural phenomena (lightning, rainbows, etc.) as it relates to clouds.
- BLACK & WHITE- This category is for all black and white photos. Subject matter can depict any of the specified categories listed above.

NOTE: ALL PHOTOS MUST BE TAKEN IN THE OUT-OF-DOORS WITHIN LAKE COUNTY.

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#### **CONTEST RULES & REGULATIONS**

- The Photo Contest is open to amateur photographers only. A professional is defined as one whose primary source of income (50% or more) results from his/her photographic work.
- Photographic images must be a minimum of 5 x 7 inches and not exceed 11 x 16 inches. Note: Matted panoramic images cannot exceed 27" total width.
- Photographs must be individually matted with a single white mat-no double matting. Photos cannot be framed, and the photographer's name cannot appear on the front. Failure to comply with these rules will cause photos to be disqualified.
- 4. A "Photograph Identification Form" (attached) must be securely attached to the lower right corner on the back of each entry. Additionally, the contestant's name, address and phone number should be clearly printed directly on the back of each entry. Contestants must submit a completed entry form (attached) with entry fee and photograph(s).
- Photos will be judged on depiction of category, technical quality, composition and originality. The independent judges' decisions are final.
- Lake Metroparks reserves the right to combine categories in the event of insufficient entries in order to preserve the integrity of the contest. All categories may not necessarily receive sequential awards.
- 7. All photographs must remain on exhibit at Penitentiary Glen Nature Center, 8668 Kirtland-Chardon Rd., Kirtland, through the conclusion of the exhibit on Sunday, August 6, 2017. Contestants must pick up their entries from Penitentiary Glen Nature Center between August 7 & August 31, 2017 between 9 am and 4:30 pm daily. Lake Metroparks will not be responsible for photographs not picked up by August 31.

- 8. Only work not previously entered in the Lake Metroparks' Annual Amateur Photography Contest will be accepted. Lake Metroparks reserves the right to disqualify any photograph not properly mounted, not taken in the out-of-doors, or does not meet the entry/category requirements. Lake Metroparks also reserves the right and authority to reject any photograph(s) that may seem objectionable to participants and/or visitors.
- It is the sole responsibility of the photographer
  to secure permission from any person or persons
  appearing in his/her photo(s). Any photograph entered
  in this contest may be used, without charge, in future
  Lake Metroparks publications or promotions. Photo
  credit will be given for all photos used.
- 10. All reasonable caution will be exercised with all photographs; however, Lake Metroparks is not responsible for any damage or loss that may occur. Due to the nature of the show, Velcro will be used in hanging the photographs. Photo Title Cards will be mounted on the bottom center of each photo after the judging has taken place.
